Rewarding Bad Behaviour

Comments were made that school seems to place more emphasis on rewarding improvement in poor behaviour than in rewarding children who consistently demonstrate good behaviour. Whilst it is true that we appear to spend a disproportionate amount of time on poor behavioural issues, it is necessary to do so in order to attain a consistently higher standard of behaviour throughout school. All children who display any form of good behaviour are rewarded in some way and good behaviour is always acknowledged openly so that everyone can see that there are benefits to being well behaved. Children are their own best critics and this can be seen when Head Boy/Girl, Prefects or members of the School Parliament are being considered. Peer children will always nominate/support each other where good behaviours are consistently shown. Similarly, children, with guidance from their Class Teacher will always choose someone with good behaviour to be their KiVA Representative. Further examples of how good behaviour is rewarded can be seen each week when a child in each class is named as Worker of the Week; in addition to this, the Head Teacher names a child who overall merits special mention weekly. Children are also encouraged to volunteer for "Famous on a Friday" this is where children stand up in assembly and talk about themselves and take questions from their peers. Children's positive attitudes are recognised on a daily basis by their

respective class teachers who award 'Dojos' and by writing positive comment of encouragement in their workbooks

We ask all parents to support the school in nurturing positive behaviour; we all want the best for your child not only through education but by preparing them to be model citizens to help through their adult life.
