

## Year 4 Visit to Tatton Park.

Dear Parents/carers,

We have organised a visit for Year 4 to attend Tatton Park in Knutsford, Cheshire on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

We will be exploring the turbulent world of the Anglo Saxons and Vikings in 10<sup>th</sup> Century AD in an exciting, hands-on workshop. The typical activities of the workshop will include shelter building, outdoor cookery, threshing/winnowing, deer walk and weapons. The historical characters will help us examine what life was like for these two groups of people: considering home life, religion, work, battle, trade, food, language, and geography.

**If you wish your child may like to attend this visit dressed as a Viking. Please do not go to any expense and only use things you have at home to make a costume otherwise children may wear their own clothes providing they are weather appropriate.**

We will be travelling by coach, leaving around 9.05am. We expect to be back at school between 3.15pm-3.30pm depending on traffic.

Your child will require a packed lunch in a disposable bag. No fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate please. School can provide a picnic bag if you prefer. If your child is eligible for free school meals a picnic can be provided free of charge upon request. Please indicate your preference on attached form.

The cost of this visit is **£24.00**. A **deposit of £4.00 to secure your child's place should be made on or before Monday 15<sup>th</sup> April**. You are welcome to make partial payment towards the cost of this visit on School Comms. Please can any remaining balance be made in full on or before Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May.

As we hold your child's medical records from the last visit, we will use this again however please indicate on the form to be returned to school if there are any medical changes or if your child suffers from travel sickness or hayfever and if they require medication for this. We will send a medical form home if we do not have one on file. Please remember to provide a sunhat, suncream and an extra bottle of water should the weather be lovely.
